

Simple Crochet Dishcloth

29 Stitches

100% Cotton yarn - worsted weight (*estimating 1.5 oz; I just used what I had on hand*)

Size "H" hook

ch 30

- 1. sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, ch 2, turn. (*29 stitches*)**
- 2. sc in 1st sc, *sk 1 sc, (dc and sc) in next sc, repeat from * across, ch 2, turn.**
- 3. sc in 1st sc, *sk next dc, (dc and sc) in next sc, repeat from * across, ch 2, turn.**
- 4. Repeat row 3 until desired length. (*Mine measures 8 1/2 inches.*)**

Border

- 1. sc evenly around cloth, (3 sc) in each corner, sl st to beg sc, ch 1, do not turn work.**
- 2. rev sc evenly around cloth, sl st to beg rev sc, fasten off.**
- 3. Weave in ends.**

Easy Doubles Dishcloth

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Skill: Beginner

Size: About 9½" square

Materials: Worsted Weight Cotton Yarn: Multicolor (*Sugar 'n Cream – Guacamole*)

Crochet Hook: Size H-8 (5.00 mm)

JOINING WITH SC

When instructed to join with sc, begin with sl knot on hook, insert hook in st or sp indicated, yo and pull up a loop, yo and draw through both loops on hook.

DISHCLOTH

Row 1: (Right Side) Ch 32, dc in 4th ch from hook (*skipped ch counts as first dc*), (dc in next ch) across. (30 dc)

Rows 2-17: Ch 3 (*counts as first dc*), turn, (dc in next dc) across. (30 dc)

At the end of Row 17, DO NOT FINISH OFF.

Edging

Rnd 1: With **right side** facing, * working in sides of rows, evenly sc across *, working in unused lps of starting ch, 3 sc in first ch, [sc in next ch] across to last ch, 3 sc in last ch; rep from * to * once; working in Row 17, 3 sc in first dc, [sc in next dc] across to last dc, ch 10 (*hanger*), 3 sc in last dc; join with sl st to first sc. Finish off and weave in ends.

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
